

DOUBLEENTRY BOOKKEEPING

Each row contains 2 answers which overlap by one letter. Thus BAD and DOG would enter the grid as BADOG. A row's answers are clued as a pair, separated by a semicolon; the two clues are presented in random order. These pairs, identified by letters solely for convenience of reference, are presented in no particular order; solvers must determine which row a pair belongs in. As a help, the overlapping letters are in alphabetical order, top to bottom. Down answers are entered normally.
