

SEAMLESS LOGIC

Identically numbered Across clues are presented as a group, in random order; solvers must deduce which grid each answer belongs in. Down clues are presented normally, grid by grid. Each grid's central Across and Down entry must be deduced from crossing letters. The shaded center squares, taken in order, spell out what the successful solver's logic (and grids) will not contain. All answers are 7 letters long; hyphenated answers are so indicated; all other answers are single words. *Constructed in 2018; grids use up too much real estate for a magazine.*
